The Guest House Inn, a popular choice in Music City is less than 1 Mile from the Grand Ole Opry and in the middle of all the honky-tonking and fun. Complimentary Shuttle to the Opryland Complex and Airport is included. Free Continental Breakfast and Parking, as well as laundry facilities, Pool, and of course, a Cocktail Lounge

To make reservations, do not use a third party; call the hotel directly at 615-885-4030 and ask for the Hanson Reunion Block. If you need an airport shuttle, call the hotel and the shuttle runs every hour.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- The Hotel Special Rate is \$104.25 per night total for Double or Single Occupancy. The Rate includes continental breakfast each morning. If you prefer a heartier breakfast, Cracker Barrel is across the street.
- Each room has an iron and ironing board, mini-fridge, Wi-Fi, coffee pot and other amenities.
- The special room prices are good three days before and after the reunion.
 - Reservations must be made by August 25, 2017.
 - You may cancel up to 24 hours in advance.
 - Wheelchair-accessible rooms are available.
 - Parking is free.
- There is a free shuttle to and from the airport that leaves the hotel every hour on the hour for the 15 minute trip. Call the hotel at 615-885-4030, and the front desk will tell you where in the airport to go to be retrieved.

THE GRAND OLE OPRY

Nashville is the home of the Grand Ole Opry. Founded in 1925, The Opry House is the home of Nashville's weekly country music concert and the longest running radio program broadcasted by WSM. The Reunion has no scheduled evening activities on Tuesday night and the Opry will have a show that night. Call 615-871-6779 or visit www.opry.com for tickets. Veteran Discounts available if you ask. To assure that you get tickets to the Opry, order them by June 1. The Opry was not made a part of our formal activities due to the logistics of planning that far ahead. Our Hotel offers shuttle service to the Opry; inquire at desk. Attending the Grand Ole Opry is a must for the Nashville Experience.

Special Reunion Activity

Private Nashville Trolley Tour: We have arranged a special opportunity for our group. We will be transported by trolley from the Hotel to the Ryman Theater, the original home of the Grand Ole Opry. We will enjoy a guided tour of this historic facility. The acoustics in the Ryman are considered comparable to the Mormon Tabernacle.

Ryman Theater: The structure was the dream of a powerful, charismatic evangelist named Sam Jones. On May 10, 1885, a wealthy, rough hewn riverboat captain named Thomas Ryman heard Jones preach at a tent revival three blocks from the current site. Jones' words transformed Ryman's life. Ryman and Jones dreamed of creating a tabernacle as the religious gathering place for the city. Eventually, Nashvillians joined Ryman and Jones and their dream came true.

The citizens donated both time and money to complete the Union Gospel Tabernacle in 1892. The building was used in many different ways, until June 5, 1943 when it became the home of the Grand Ole Opry.

Nashville Highlights Tour: After the Ryman we will board the Trolley for a city tour. Sites include: Country Music Hall of Fame, Johnny Cash and Goo Goo Candy, Marathon Motor Works, Parthenon, Vanderbilt University, Belmont Mansion, Bobby's Idle Hour/Music Row, and The Gulch. We will be stopping at a couple of these sites and around Noon we will stop at the Nashville Farmers Market where you can explore the market and grab lunch on your own. This is not a traditional Farmer's Market, but rather an array of outdoor restaurants, snack shops, parlors, bars, etc. Lunch will be about an hour and then we will continue our Trolley Tour. Our tour will end at our hotel around 3:30 to allow adequate time for Grand Ole Opry or Dinner Theater Ticket Holders to rest and get ready for their evening.

Grimm, Larry Nelson and their faithful's will be stationed in the Hotel Bar...spending a while with them will be very informative.

Wednesday, September, 27: Morning/Afternoon Free. At 4:00PM there was be a business meeting in the Hospitality Room. All affairs of our Reunions, Finances and Goals will be discussed. All former crew members, their family and guests are encouraged to attend and participate in recommending cities and voting on the location for our 2019 Hanson Reunion.
